Trash Can Use Suggested

Trash bags providing entertainment for local wildlife

One topic of discussion at the 1999 Meeting was trash left at the end of the Springy Pond Road at Route 180 in Clifton. Trash collection day in the Town of Clifton is normally on Mondays. When Springy Pond residents deposit their trash at the end of the road prior to Monday morning, the local wildlife tears into the bags and scatters the trash about the intersection during the night. This creates an unsightly mess.

A suggestion has been made that those leaving trash at the end of the road should place their bags of trash in barrels. This would hinder the efforts of the wildlife to get into the trash. Duncan Jordan had volunteered to pick up empty barrels labeled with the residents name and return them to their owners. Cindy Grant also indicated that trash could be placed in the dumpster at the Clifton Town Office.

The seasonal residents of Springy Pond that transport their trash to the end of the Springy Pond Road can easily transport their trash home with them. The hometowns of the seasonal residents all provide curbside trash collection. If you must leave your trash at the end of the road before Monday morning, please make use of a trash barrel. ❖

Speeding Traffic on Road

Safety of pedestrians a concern for many

At the 1999 Annual Meeting, several of those in attendance expressed concern about the excessive speed of some traffic on the Springy Pond Road. Not only was this issue discussed last year; this has been a common concern for many residents throughout the years.

Since Springy Pond Road is a private road, a speed limit cannot be established nor enforced by local law enforcement officials. The most we can do is pass the word along to those that travel the road to drive at a reasonable and prudent speed. Special care must be taken where the road passes by residences along the shoreline. In these areas, the road is narrow, sight distances are limited, and traffic is entering and exiting the road from driveways. The road is not only used by vehicles, but by pedestrians and cyclists as well.

The problem of excessive speed is not usually attributed to the Springy Pond residents, but with the visitors. Please inform your visitors that they must share the road with pedestrians and cyclists and should always travel the Springy Pond Road with this in mind. ❖

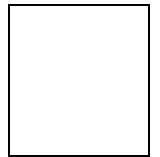
