Road projects completed

Association responsible for several improvements

Since last summer, Springy Pond Association has spent more than \$8,300 on various road maintenance and improvement projects.

On October 22, 2005, John Williams Construction replaced the three Springy Pond Road culverts nearest Route 180 and added one culvert at the power-line crossing.

On November 2 and 3, 2005, Gordon Fellis graded Springy Pond Road from Route 180 to the Springy Pond Outlet and Middle Pond Road from Springy Pond Road to Hendricksons Lane.

On November 20, 2005, John Williams Construction excavated gravel washed from the road into the Springy Pond Outlet.

In early April 2006, John Williams Construction widened Springy Pond Road at the third turn in from Route 180 and at the power-line crossing.

On April 15, 2006, Herbert R. Jordan, Sr. graded and raked Springy Pond Road and Middle Pond Road.

On April 22, 2006 John Williams Construction delivered 48 yards of gravel to Middle Pond Road and Hendricksons Lane, where it was spread by John Sieber.

Many thanks to John Williams Construction for providing donated labor and materials.★

Happy summer 2006---has it arrived yet?

I would like to offer a big THANK YOU to the gravel pit owners who have made a huge effort to maintain the camp road from the pits to 180. Also, thank you to Gary Grant for grading the road with his skidder. Your efforts do not go unnoticed, and we all appreciate keeping the road in good shape.

We have had grading done by Herbert Jordan and hope to have him in again after the 4th of July to go over it again. Our plan is to also put down calcium from Pomeroy's pit to the outlet, and hope to control some of the dust.

I spoke with the folks at the Clifton Town Office in regards to the fire numbers, and have been told they hope to have them ready by the time we get our tax bills in August.

We continue to hear complaints about speeding on the road, and again, I ask your diligence in keeping this under control and remind all who visit you to do the same.

You may have noticed that the pond has been getting a progressively higher water level over the last few years. The rain plays a part, but also is the status of the culverts at the outlet. Todd and I are looking into the options of seeing what monies are available through grants, etc, to see if there are resources available to us to maintain and help deter soil and bank erosion that is happening at the pond.
